Parent Questionnaire Results

A huge thank you to everyone who completed the questionnaire. Here, we will be sharing the results with you and our subsequent actions.

We received 14 responses from families of children attending Pitton CE Primary School. The questionnaire consisted of 15 questions. The teaching team were delighted to see so much positive feedback, some of which we have shared here. Those responses also suggest areas for development and we have responded to them below. Those that were personal, and related to a specific child, remain confidential to that family.

Actions to be taken by the school

- **Tea on the Playground and Coffee Mornings** – In order for parents to meet school representatives we will continue to hold a joint event with FOPs and Governors and have 'Tea on The Playground' or Coffee Mornings 3 times a year. This will give parents an opportunity to meet with myself and discuss the areas of improvement identified above e.g. wider personal development, subject coverage and communication regarding how your child is performing. The Autumn term date has been set as 9am on Friday 3rd November 2013.
- **Parent Consultations** – Parents will be invited to Parent Consultations in November 2023. The exact date will be announced in the Pitton News shortly. Parent Consultations happen twice a year with an end of year report shared in July. At these consultations parents will be given the results of any assessments, current attainment and recommendations on how to support their child's learning at home. If you have any concerns or wish to discuss progress with your child's class teacher we ask that you contact admin@pitton.wilts.sch.uk or use the messaging system on Class Dojo.
- **Clubs and Wider Responsibilities** – September 2023 will see the return of a range of after school clubs on every weekday. There are currently the following clubs on offer to pupils: KS1 dance, KS2 dance, Choir, Netball, Football, KS1 gym club, KS2 sport club and Eco Club. Information regarding signing up is available on Parent Mail. In school music lessons will also return including saxophone, clarinet, guitar, ukulele and piano. Pupils will continue to be invited to be House Captains, Class Monitors, Sustainability Peer Review leads for Pickwick Academy Trust Southern Hub, Tour guides for prospective parents, Playground leaders, Collective Worship Committee members and representatives of the Eco club including Chair and Secretary. This year we are also introducing the Rights Respecting Committee as part of our work towards the Silver accreditation of the Rights Respecting Award.

We hope you find these results informative and interesting to read. Again, I would like to thank all those parents and carers who took the time to complete the questionnaire, for your support for our school and providing suggestions for areas to develop.
